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## Apple iPad App of the Day: iTunes U

Your students will experience the courses you build using the free iTunes U app for iPad. It's a powerful app that lets students have all the materials for the course right at their fingertips.

- Students can view all the assignments for your course in a list and check off each task as it's completed.
- When a student takes notes while watching a video, iTunes U remembers the location of the note.
